Distance Learning & Reporting Requirements

All items below must be finalized and details submitted in the Learning Continuity & Attendance Plan due by September 30, 2020

- Continuity of Instruction
 - The LEA will provide continuity of instruction during the school year to ensure pupils have access to a full curriculum of substantially similar quality regardless of method of delivery
- Pupil Participation and Progress
 - The LEA will ensure access to devices and connectivity for all pupils to support distance learning and will report on any actions that will be taken to measure participating, pupil progress and time value of pupil work.
- Pupil Engagement and Outreach
 - The LEA will ensure pupil engagement and outreach and provide procedures for tiered reengagement strategies for pupils who are absent from distance learning and outreach to pupils and their parents or guardians when pupils are not meeting compulsory education requirements.
- Support for Pupils with Unique Needs:
 - The LEA will provide support to pupils with unique needs including support for EL, pupils with exceptional needs served across the full continuum of placements, pupils in foster care, and pupils who are experiencing homelessness.
- Pupil Learning Loss
 - The LEA will address pupil learning loss that resulted from the COVID closure.
- Increased or Improved Services for unduplicated students

- Frontier Internet Access for Families
 - \$10 / month plan for students who have access issues
- Verizon for Hot Spot Coverage
 - Cell coverage issue
- CANVAS software for curriculum install on Chromebooks (through EDCOE)

Surveys

What did we learn?

A majority of the people responded they want classroom instruction. The second choice was a blended learning model

On a scale of 5 we scored an average score of 4 with the comfort level of parents sending their child to school if we follow CDC health and safety guidelines

A few people responded they will not be sending their student(s) to school if the children are required to wear masks.

Families and staff are concerned about appropriate cleaning and disinfection of the school

If we have to return to distance learning more training on the process is a key element to make it more successful

So with all of our guidance from CDE, CDC, Alpine Public Health, Staff and Family surveys where do we go from here?

The following information is our best imagined plan at this moment in time. Because Covid is rapidly changing in our state everything we have thought about for opening up our schools may not even be allowed to take place.

Sick Policy

If you are ill stay home:

Any fever of 100.4 or higher, coughing, sore throat, muscle aches, difficultly breathing, new loss of taste or smell, chills, diarrhea, vomiting, green-runny nose, puss/oozing eyes, disease or condition (i.e.-ringwork, head lice, chicken pox, measles, mumps, pink eye etc.)

If someone is sick when they are given their daily screen they will not be allowed to enter the facility

If a student becomes sick at school they must be picked up immediately. If a child develops any of the symptoms listed above, they will be isolated while the parent or guardian is notified. It is critical the student (and any siblings) be picked up within one hour of notification

If we have an active coronavirus case we will have to close the facility for at least two weeks.

Closure Policy

Working with out Public Health officer we have been told if any student or staff member test positive for Covid 19 we are to close the physical plant, disinfect the school. We then can look at reopening in 14 days.
