Dear Students and Families,

Hello from your new school psychologist! I feel so fortunate to be joining this school community. I'm excited to be starting my 19th year as a school psychologist at Diamond Valley!

Next week I will begin facilitating our Social Emotional Learning (SEL) lessons. Students will learn how to understand and manage their emotions, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, set and achieve goals, and make positive choices. Our first lessons will focus on Growth Mindset and Goal-Setting: Students will learn how to pay attention and manage distractions, develop a growth mindset, and apply goal-setting strategies to their social and academic lives.

In addition to providing Social Emotional Learning lessons, I will be available to meet with students for small group and individual counseling.

To receive counseling, a student is referred by their parent, guardian, or teacher. Students can also request to see me. Students may come to my office to talk about things that impact their learning at school, such as friendships, study skills, and self-esteem. In my office, students can feel free to talk about what worries them and to ask questions.

I feel strongly about the importance of working closely with families, teachers and students to ensure that students are receiving the support they need to be successful in school and beyond.
